NATCON and Scholarships



Scholarship process

1. National and area scholarships will take precedence over squadron scholarships
2. Squadron scholarships based on rack and stack (mainly hours and involvement)
3. Recipients will be Venmoed (or paid cash, but preferably Venmoed) partial/full scholarship to register
4. Within 24 hours, recipient registers and sends screenshot of registration confirmation AND charge on bank account to C/Dickey (required for school to reimburse)

So how much funding do we currently have?

Squadron balance - \$64

Alumni - \$299

GFA - \$800

National MoM - \$299

USCFC (scholarships) - \$1,495

USCFC (gas) - \$287

Area scholarships (TBD) - \$0 to \$798

Total monies: \$3,244 to \$4,042



NATCON and Scholarships



Breakdown of monies (w/o area scholarships):

Gas money - \$287

Six full scholarships - \$1,794

Seven partial scholarships - \$1,047

Squadron balance - \$116

Spring Pledge Hotwash



- Staff was readily available, albeit divided on what a proper class size is
- Need to sell benefits more (use the word “scholarship” a lot)
- Incorporate pictures of past NATCONs, interactions with DVs, etc. and possibly use or make a recruiting video
- Intensity is reduced with fewer candidates... almost makes it one-on-one experience with training staff (but we can adapt)
- Keep AAS mysterious and avoid posting suggestive pictures on social media of CTP publicly that gives away training environment
- A lot of people do not follow through when they say they plan to pledge or plan to stay in (~50% attrition rate)



Spring Pledge Hotwash



- Non-Arnies keep gossiping about training environment and ruin surprise aspect
- Fall pledging preferred over spring because everyone is new, most people have no prior military-related experience, and nobody really knows what they're getting themselves into
- Mix up training program a bit each semester... add on to air system/capabilities information and force packaging from this past fall
- If spring pledging is continued and numbers stay low, develop contingency plans (at the same time, we should be able to adapt)
- Avoid poisoning the well by saying "we can't train with less than _____ people" in front of the candidates... that is up to CC and CTO
